John 14:1-14 or John 14:1-7

Looking for Signs of Resurrection and New Life

This is a resurrection treasure hunt for the Sundays in Easter season. You will need to do a few things ahead of time to prepare:

• Prepare a selection of edible things that can help you taste the goodness of God that you can take with you on your walk

Or

If you have access to garden space where there are edible herbs growing (and you can confidently and safely identify these), plan ahead of time which herbs you will go to taste on you treasure hunt.

- Make simple resurrection symbols to leave on your journey. These are to indicate that you have tasted something that points to the new life of Christ in the world. (Please use natural or biodegradable materials.)
 Some ideas:
 - Small stones (You could draw a cross, heart, candle, sun, dove etc. on each)
 - Cut out small pieces of paper and draw an image or write a word that reminds you of God's resurrection love
 - Cut out paper hearts in different colours
- Give everyone who is going on the treasure hunt a share of the resurrection symbols
- Pray together as you begin your journey:

Jesus, our hearts and our taste buds need your help. Help us to taste signs of your new life in the world. We are so glad for your love for us and for all of creation. Amen

- Blow out the candle before you leave!
- Head out into your neighbourhood with your taste buds open for signs of Jesus' new life in the world. When you taste something that connects your heart or your imagination with God's resurrection love, place your resurrection sign there. You may choose to say, "Christ is risen!" and those you are with can reply, "He is risen indeed!"

 When you have put out all the resurrection symbols and you return home from your walk, close with a song. Jesus promises us that God's light can shine in our lives, too:

Feast!

Have a snack together and talk about the things you tasted on your new life treasure hunt:

- I wonder what was the favourite thing that you noticed on our walk.
- I wonder what you tasted that you think is the most important.
- I wonder if there is something you tasted on your walk that would make someone else smile.
- I wonder if there is something you noticed that could remind someone else that Jesus loves them.

Share

Later in the day or the week, find a way to tell or show someone else about one of the things you tasted on your new life treasure hunt. Think about someone who you want to be filled with the light and love of Jesus, maybe someone you are close to or maybe someone you don't know that well. Write them a card, send them a picture, give them a phone call or video chat, or maybe drop off one of the resurrection symbols that you made outside their door with a note.
